Winning surgeries will get cash prizes to help them to continue their work in support of carers and to thank staff. Three Awards will be given out to GP surgeries: the Gold winner will receive £2,000, the Silver winner will receive £1,000 and the Bronze winner will receive £750.

Simplyhealth Carers' Choice Awards

As well as inviting surgeries to apply for an award, we also ask carers to join in. They can enter the Simplyhealth Carers' Choice Award by writing in to thank their GP for all the great work that they do to support them. If you know any carers who may want to do this please ask them to write and tell us why they think their GP should win. Please ask them to give us their name, address and telephone number, and their GP's name, address and telephone number. The winning GP and nominating carer will each get £250. We'll also present the GP with a framed copy of the winning nomination letter, and a certificate for the surgery.

- A judging panel will assess all applications
- Illegible, incomplete or fraudulent entries will be disqualified
- Winners will be expected to take part in post event publicity
