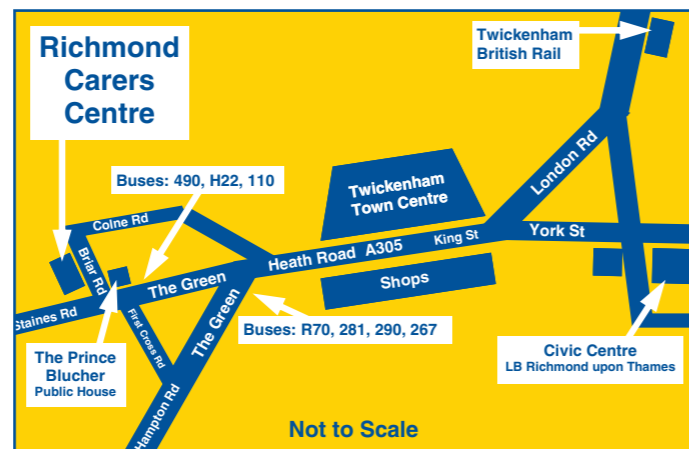

Getting help from your GP

Some GP surgeries:

- **Offer flexible appointments to carers that take into account your special needs.** If your GP does not offer this service ask why. If an appointment is to include a discussion about the person you care for, let the receptionist know that their notes will need to be available or a double appointment booked.
- **Operate a carers register. This is a list of all patients at the surgery who have caring roles.** Ask at the surgery if they have an active carers register. If they do, ask to be added to the list. It will make your GP and the surgery staff more aware of your caring responsibilities. If you have any problems with getting added to the carers register, we are happy to help with this matter.
- **Offer other services** for example, counselling, physiotherapy, annual health checks, home visits, stop smoking programmes and weight loss programmes.

Why not ask the reception staff for specific services offered by your GP surgery.

Young Carers in Education

Young carers may not only be supporting a family member(s) with long term health conditions or learning disabilities, but also coping with all the demands of school or college.

The Richmond Carers Centre has a dedicated Young Carers School Liaison Worker who:

- Is a point of contact for schools and colleges regarding young carers
- Is working with schools and college staff to raise awareness of the needs of young carers in education
- Liaises with school or college on behalf of individual young carers and their families
- Is helping schools and colleges identify pupils/students who may be young carers and in order to better support them.

People with Learning Disabilities (PLD) Carers' Support

Young Carers Support

It is recognised that young people (under 18) often support members of their family who are sick, disabled, old or frail, in many ways, from helping around the home to providing emotional support. This may mean they miss out on the usual activities of childhood or suffer additional stress not usually experienced in the early years of life.

To help, we can offer support to young carers to access events and activities such as, after school clubs, extra tuition, group trips and music lessons. We also have regular school holiday activities.
